

# Variables in PHP



<b>Address</b>	<code>{value_address}</code>
<b>Contact Person</b>	<code>{value_contact_person}</code>
<b>Mobile Number</b>	<code>{value_mobile_number}</code>
<b>Email</b>	<code>{value_email}</code>

Variables are nothing but identifiers to the memory location to store data. We can create any number of variables. In PHP all the variables begin with a dollar sign "\$" and the value can be assigned using the "=" operator as shown below: Another important thing in PHP is that all the statements must end with a semicolon ";". In PHP we needn't have to specify the variable type, as it takes the data type of the assigned value. From the above example we understand that '\$Name' is of Data type String and '\$Age' is of type Numeric.
